<u> Petersburg, Alaska – Day 6</u>

LeConte Glacier by Jetboat: With a skilled captain, this thrilling narrated adventure by jet boat offers an intimate and unforgettable experience of LeConte Bay and its eponymous glacier. Enriched by our guide's expansive knowledge of the region's geology and natural history, we expect to navigate close to beautiful blue icebergs where harbor seals and their pups as well as seabirds often come to perch. At the end of the fjord, we'll come face to face with the one of the most active tidewater glaciers in North America. \$349 per person.

Sport Fishing along the Inside Passage: The remote and pristine waters of the Inside Passage deliver world-class fishing surrounded by some of Alaska's most breathtaking natural scenery. In addition, these nutrient-rich waters are protected from the large swells of the open Pacific Ocean, affording a more pleasant experience. Setting out from Petersburg with our expert Captain and crew, you'll fish for a variety of species including salmon, halibut and rock cod. Coffee, snacks and beverages are provided. \$349 per person.

<u> Wrangell, Alaska – Day 8</u>

Wild Bears of Anan: Situated about 30 miles outside of Wrangell in the Tongass National Forest, the Anan Wildlife Observatory Site offers a chance to see and photograph Alaskan wildlife in their natural habitat. At the heart of the site, Anan Creek boasts the largest run of pink salmon in Southeast Alaska – an irresistible draw for significant numbers of black and brown bears that come to feast on the bounty. The site offers a covered viewing shelter, open decks and a photo blind. Access is carefully managed by the US Forest Service and the number of visitors is strictly limited to ensure an authentic, high-quality wilderness experience; this excursion will sell out, so we recommend booking as early as possible. **\$499 per person**.

Premium Glacier Discovery: Join our expert naturalist guides on this exciting jetboat adventure that will bring you close to one of Alaska's most spectacular glaciers. Cruise toward the massive face of the Le Conte Glacier through pristine waters studded with icebergs as our guides share insight into the geology and natural history of the fjord. Le Conte is a remarkably active glacier, and visitors can regularly witness the spectacle of large chunks of ice calving from its face with a thunderous roar. \$399 per person.

Wrangell, Alaska – Day 8: Continued

Fishing the Inside Passage: The remote and pristine waters of the Inside Passage deliver world-class fishing surrounded by some of Alaska's most breathtaking natural scenery. In addition, these nutrient-rich waters are protected from the large swells of the open Pacific Ocean, affording a more pleasant experience. Stikine River Wilderness + Glacier Lake by Jetboat: Fed by glaciers, the Stikine River flows through vast untouched tracts of temperate rainforest punctuated by rugged snowcapped peaks. Aboard a comfortable, skillfully captained jetboat, this excursion crosses the 17-mile wide delta and takes you upriver into the Tongass National Forest. Maneuvering through back-sloughs and narrow passages enhances wildlife-viewing opportunities as we navigate toward Shakes Lake where, conditions permitting, you'll have a breathtaking view of Shakes Glacier. Fascinating narration about the region's natural wonders and dramatic Gold Rush history enhances this guided excursion. \$369 per person.

<u> Ketchikan, Alaska – Day 10</u>

Brunch at George Inlet Lodge: Showcasing Ketchikan culture and cuisine, this excursion begins with at Totem Row where you'll find more than 20 totem poles, most of them collected and restored in the 1930's by a Civilian Conservation Corps program. With insight from our expert guide, you'll learn about the history and cultural heritage of the Tlingit people that carved these totem poles. Then continue to the *George Inlet Lodge* set in an historic 1940's cannery bunkhouse overlooking the water and forested mountains beyond. Here in this idyllic setting, you'll sit down to a sumptuous feast featuring unlimited fresh Dungeness Crab, bagels with smoked salmon dip and bottomless mimosas. **\$169 per person**.
